Hurricane Michael – 2018

Location

Chipley is a city in the Florida Panhandle, 102 miles northeast of Pensacola. It has a population of approximately 3,600 people and is the county seat of Washington County. Chipley was originally named "Orange," but was renamed in 1882 after Florida state senator William Dudley Chipley.

Falling Waters State Park, home to the highest waterfall in Florida, is located about 5 miles south of Chipley.

Disaster

Hurricane Michael made landfall near Mexico Beach, FL on October 10, 2018. It was the third-most intense Atlantic hurricane to make landfall in the contiguous United States. Hurricane Michael caused at least \$14.5 billion dollars in damages.

MDS Response

MDS RV volunteers will be staying at Miracle Valley Spirit of Holiness Fellowship Church. This is a large campus that is tucked back in the pine tree farms of rural Florida. Water, sewer and 30-amp electric hookups will be available at each RV spot.

Volunteers will be focusing on interior repair work.

Directions

Use GPS to direct you to Miracle Valley Spirit of Holiness Fellowship Church. The last ¼ mile is a dirt road. The whole property is on the left side of the road. Once you enter, the parsonage is on the left, sanctuary is in the middle, and the RV hookups are on the right side of the sanctuary (north side).
